For the first time in the history of the World Table Tennis Championship, plastic balls will be used in matches Again something unprecedented is going to take place in this World the Table Tennis Championship, as in doubles events the ITTF has decided that the competing pair need not be players from the same nation. In the past pairs were from the same nation.

Five hundred and forty nine paddlers - 311 male and 238 female players- will vie for the top honours in the World TT championship. Hundred national associations will be represented by its players in the world championship. The media will be present in full strength to cover the event as more than 900 accredited media personnels are expected to cover this event. The organising committee is leaving no stone unturned for the smooth conduct of the tournament as 963 volunteers and 265 will be working round the clock for the tournament's success.
