ACTC 2022-2023 for Table Tennis

Minutes of ACTC meeting held on 22nd March, 2022: Table Tennis Federation of India (TTFI)

A meeting to finalize the Annual Calendar for Training and Competition (ACTC) for Table Tennis for the year 2022-23 was held on 22nd March 2022 at 05.30 PM under the Chairmanship of Smt. Sujata Chaturvedi, Secretary (Sports) MYA&S at the Conference Hall, Sports Authority of India HQ, New Delhi. The list of participants is annexed.

2. At the outset, Member, Committee of Administrators, TTFI listed the projected targets for Table Tennis including Commonwealth Games 2022 and Asian Games 2022. TTFI submitted the following measurable outcomes:

3. TTFI presented the plans for the National Coaching Camps and Foreign Exposures for events leading to Asian Games 2022 in September. The budget summary was presented thereafter in accordance with the revised norms for funding under Assistance to NSF Scheme.

4. TTFI committed to publish its complete selection policy on the official website by 05th April 2022.

5. Furthermore, Member, Committee of Administrators, TTFI made following commitments, which were included as binding decisions as a part of approved ACTC calendar and budget:

- 5.1 More focussed and targeted Junior Development Programme with ratio for expenditure for Senior and Junior age groups as presented in the ACTC proposal.
- 5.2 Gender budgeting to be done so as to ensure equal expenditure for Men and Women.
- 5.3 Strengthening and capacity building in National Camps through inclusion of Sports Science Staff and ensuring scientific evaluation of campers and targeted interventions thereof. Data management of the performance evaluations be ensured.
- 5.4 Maintaining a proper system of utilisation of government grants under the scheme.
- 5.5 Displaying on website of TTFI of all grants received under the scheme.
- 5.6 Strict compliance of WADA Code and NADA rules, details of educational plans for paddlers and display of Anti-Doping awareness programmes on their respective websites.
- 5.7 Partnership for various programs under Khelo India.

6. The calendar and budget were considered and approved with modifications pursuant to deliberations. The total budget for the annual calendar for training and competition was approved for TTFI up to March, 2023 with a cap of **Rs. 8.00 Crores**, of this 10% is earmarked for contingencies and 3% for administrative expenses of the NSF as per the latest norms of MYAS dated 28th February 2022. It is emphasized that NSF will allocate adequate budget as demanded for Commonwealth Games 2022 & Asian Games 2022 & ensure that all needs of athletes as projected under ACTC are fulfilled.

7. The budget is approved for the following requirements:

7.1 National Coaching Camp (Senior & Junior)

A limit of maximum of 90 camps days and 60 camp days in a year for seniors and juniors age group respectively shall be adhered to. *Placed at Annexure - I(A), I(B).*

7.2 International Competition (Senior & Juniors)

Foreign Exposure in all age groups and across all events should be with a focused approach on targeted events where there are realistic medal chances and with commensurate exposures to the Junior Group. Further, limit of 90 days in a year for training and competition abroad has to be adhered to. *Placed at Annexure - II(A), II(B), II(C).*

7.3 Remuneration - Indian Coaches and Support Staff

The names and salaries of the coaches and support staff to be empanelled for the National Coaching Camp shall be approved separately by the Empanelment Committee by **30.04.2022**. *Placed at Annexure - III(A), III(B).*

7.4 Remuneration - Foreign Coaches and Support Staff

The overall expenditure of foreign coaches & support staff is not to exceed 30% of the total budget sanctioned under ACTC. *Placed at Annexure - IV*

7.5 Equipment (Consumables & Ammunitions)

The NSF to procure equipment as per circular of MYAS.
Placed at Annexure - V

7.6 Domestic Competitions

Placed at Annexure - VI

8. The proposed ACTC is approved within the approved budgetary ceiling as stated at Para 6 above. A review would be undertaken after Asian Games 2022, in the month of October 2022 based on the achievements of Commonwealth Games, Asian Games, and targeted preparation for Olympics 2024, for any additional requirement of funds subject to availability of budget under the 'Assistance to NSF' Scheme.

9. Modifications to the calendar can be made by NSF with the approval of DG SAI within the overall approved budget. It is reiterated that all the guidelines mentioned in MYAS circular dated 28th February 2022 will be adhered to.

10. Secretary (Sports) emphasised on the following aspects:

- 10.1 TTFI should closely monitor Asian Games & Commonwealth Games preparation & ensure that all needs of the medal probable athletes are fulfilled.
- 10.2 TTFI should prepare the roadmap to Olympics 2024 with detailed training plan. NSF should also make complete plan for excellence in 2028 & 2032 Olympics which includes strengthening junior development programme under TOPS NCOE, strengthening domestic competition structure in line with best practices in the world, coach development plan to reduce reliance on foreign coaches, referees'/judges' development, athlete education, grass root development plan, etc. Complete plan may be submitted by 15th April 2022 post which separate discussion would be held.
- 10.3 TTFI should conduct Grassroots training program for PE teachers & other trainers under E-Khel Pathshala program. It was agreed that TTFI would provide all support for development of modules for the programme & monitor implementation.
- 10.4 Alternate training and competition plans should be prepared to cater for any possible further outbreaks of COVID 19. Also, strict protocols should be put in place to avoid Covid 19 infections during training.
- 10.5 Training and Competitions for athletes should cater for adequate recovery and peaking at the right time to ensure maximum medal probability.

11. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
